The Fargo Moorhead Association is looking for support for the issue on the November ballot for permanent flood protection planning.

It was noted that anyone interested can give to Issues as well as RPAC for Major Donors as well as other amounts.

Special thanks was given to Tish Johnson for the many hours involved in making the quilt that she donated for the convention fundraiser.

The Broker Involvement program was reviewed. ND needs 50 offices to meet the national goal and earn the President's Cup.

A video from CNN was viewed. It was a report on Powerhouse Lobbyists, which included an interview with Lawrence Yun, NAR Economist. The link to the video will be emailed to the committee and posted on NDAR's Facebook page.

NAR is hosting a webinar on October 7 that all committee members are encouraged to watch.

The challenge for 100% RPAC participation from all committees is very close to being complete. Only one member from this committee has not given at this point.

Larry Louser challenged the committee to up their investment for next year. He pledged to sustain his Golden R and give to the President's Circle after the NAR convention in New Orleans.
