Government Affairs Update February 20, 2019

Review of bills for the week of February 18th

Wednesday, February 20th is the 33rd day of the session.

<u>HB 1493</u> is the bill that required permission from neighbors/property owners if their property was included in drone video or photography. This bill passed by two votes in the House on Tuesday but was brought back for reconsideration on Wednesday. It then failed on the floor with a vote of 36-56.

<u>SB 2315</u> is the landowner rights bill. It would require hunters to obtain permission to hunt on land that will no longer have to be posted. It creates a hunter's access database. The bill passed on the Senate floor with a vote of 28-18.

<u>SB 2306</u> is the bill that allows temporary licensing of military spouses/family members. The bill received two amendments, one of which removed the seven exempted entities including the Real Estate Commission. The bill passed in the Senate with a vote of 47-0. As a result, the Senate then defeated both bills <u>SB 2126</u> (vote of 2-45) and <u>SB 2127</u> (vote of 3-44).

<u>SB 2353</u> is the bill that would require all boards and commissions follow the same rules and procedures. Amendments to the bill turned it into a study and it passed in the Senate with a vote of 42-5.

<u>HB 1184</u> is the quick take eminent domain bill. It was amended and the bill carrier indicated the committee had to heavily compromise. The bill as amended prevented the use of quick take domain. The bill failed in the House with a vote of 26-64.

<u>HB 1165</u> is the bill on nonconforming structures and was heard in House Political Subdivisions. It was brought by an appraiser who wanted all zoning to be taken over by the state rather than individual municipalities. This bill was amended significantly and passed on the House 82-7. Rep. Vetter would like the support of NDAR when it moves over to the Senate.

<u>SB 2238</u> - Eminent domain must obtain the approval of the county commissioners. This bill was defeated in the Senate with a vote of 12-35.

<u>HB 1474</u> - Infrastructure fee in lieu of special assessments. The bill was of special interest to the Bismarck Board of Realtors. It passed the House with a vote of 81-12.

<u>HB 1411</u> - is the bill which raised the bidding threshold to \$500,000 from \$150,000 for public improvements above ground. It also raises the limit for hiring an engineer with the same numbers. The bill failed 29-60 in the House.

<u>HB 1066</u> is the Prairie Dog bill. Among the distributions, there is \$30 million designated for a municipal infrastructure fund. A city may apply for a grant from this fund to construct new infrastructure or replace/repair old infrastructure. Grants are based on \$150 per person. This bill passed the House with a vote of 80-12.

<u>SB 2148</u> and <u>HB 1521</u> are the two ethics bills. Both bills were amended and passed in their respective houses.

There were no hearings scheduled for the week of February 18th because of crossover. Crossover is February 22nd and the session resumes on February 27th.
